## Vincent "Patsy" Frank

On July 11, the Italian American Sport Club lost our beloved Patsy Frank to cancer. He was 89 years old. Patsy's passing left behind a legacy from which our club will ever benefit its very founding. Born here in Rochester in 1922, little Patsy returned to Rocca di Mezzo in Abruzzo, Italy, with his family in 1928 where he attended elementary school until his dad decided to move to Ethiopia in 1936. When the war broke out, Patsy became a prisoner in the English war camps but successfully escaped to Eritrea where he met his lovely wife of 61 years, Angela. Because he was an American citizen, the American Embassy sent him back to Italy and gave him a passport so he could return to the United States in 1947.

Angela had gone back home to Palermo, and in 1950 Patsy went to Sicily to marry his sweetheart and bring her back to America where they went on to have a family of four children.

Settled back in Rochester, Patsy attended night school where he met so many charter members of the IASC who were doing the same. These young Italian immigrants had the love of soccer in common and eventually, under Patsy's leadership, founded the Italian American Sport Club in 1948. Patsy managed the IASC soccer team from 1955 to 1967 and was also president of the Rochester Soccer League for six years during this time. It was Patsy who went to New York City with Rudy Lepore to get the license to form Rochester's first professional soccer team, the Lancers. Patsy was president of the ever-growing Italian American Sport Club from 1974 to 1977. Because he was key to the formation of the IASC, Patsy was granted honorary membership for life.

Patsy was revered by all who knew him for his tremendous personal qualities and initiative. He became famous for his pasta sauce recipe that he created in 1976 which has been the centerpiece of all events hosted at the club for all these years. Together with Frank Caricchio, the casual Thursday lunches they started with some of the boys mushroomed into the bi-weekly luncheon event that draws people from all walks of life to the club for the star of the show, "Patsy's sauce". These luncheons have become a major financial resource for the club. He remained the sauce maker as long as his health permitted and we attribute the massive growth in club membership to the taste of that wonderful sauce.

Patsy will always remain a key figure in the history of the Italian American Sport Club. His picture graces the wall as one of our founding fathers. The booklet written to record the club's evolution was dedicated to him for his major role in its formation. We thank you dear Patsy, for a life well lived and well loved and for your initiative, passion and dedication to our club that owes much of its success to a vision you spearheaded with your friends over a half century ago. Your warm presence will be sorely missed but we know our club will always be in good hands because our guardian angel will be watching over us from on high.

## New U.S. Secretary of Defense speaks “Calabrese” dialect

The man President Barack Obama has chosen to be Secretary of the Department of Defense speaks “Calabrese” perfectly according to Leon Panetta’s cousin.

Leon Panetta has served the last two years as Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in the Obama Administration. Under his watch the CIA can rightly claim the most credit for finding and killing the world's most wanted terrorist, Osama bin Laden.

When he was Chief of Staff for former President Bill Clinton, Domenico Panetta, his cousin went to see him at the White House, “we understood each other perfectly both in Calabrese and in Italian but not so much in English which I don’t speak.”

He told Domenico that he is very attached culturally to Siderno and that he wanted to visit the land where his family came from but that he was always too busy to do so. Maybe now in his new position as Secretary of Defense, Leon Panetta will be able to go to Europe and to Italy and who knows may be even to Calabria.

The 72 years old Leon E. Panetta served as director of the White House budget office and the House budget committee, and was once a moderate Republican. He was forced out as head of the Office of Civil Rights because the White House under President Richard M. Nixon thought he enforced discrimination laws too enthusiastically; he then went to work for Mayor John V. Lindsay of New York. A Democrat since the early 1970s, Mr. Panetta has ties on both sides of Capitol Hill, where he served in Congress from California for eight terms, until he became President Bill Clinton’s first Budget Director in 1993 and then as his White House Chief of Staff.

Leon Panetta was born in Monterey, California, the son of Carmelina Maria Prochilo and Carmelo Frank Panetta, Italian immigrants from Siderno, province of Reggio Calabria. Siderno is one of the most important towns in the mountainous region of Calabria’s Locride area at the toe of the Italian boot. His father owned a restaurant in Monterey.

In 1960 he graduated “*magna cum laude*” with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Santa Clara University. Later in 1963 he received a Juris Doctor degree from Santa Clara University Law School. In 1964 he joined the U.S. Army as a Second Lieutenant. There he received the Army Commendation Medal and was discharged in 1966 as a First Lieutenant.

Next time you see our friend Joseph Capogreco, of “*Carosello Italiano*” fame, ask him about his famous “*paesano*” Leon Panetta. Joe, as obviously you can deduce, is also from Siderno.

## IASC Academic Scholarship

The IASC is offering for the fourth time, a scholarship to a deserving high school graduate and relative of one of our members who is interested in further education. The 2011 scholarship, based on merit, will be awarded in the amount of \$1,000.

Scholarship recipients who have best satisfied committee specified merit-only criteria are chosen from among qualifying Rochester area high school senior applicants of Italian descent who will be attending college next fall. 1. The scholarship will consist of a check for \$1000.

5. Need to provide a copy of high school or college transcript with list of accomplishments (by August 23, 2011).

7. In addition, the applicant must also submit an essay (two pages long) addressing the topic:  
*“What Makes a Teen a Good Driver.”*
8. The prize will be awarded at the regular IASC General Membership meeting of September 2, 2011.
9. Recipient and immediate family will be invited to dinner at no cost.
10. The IASC Charity Committee shall make the final decision who will be the recipient of the award.

## LIGHTEN UP - In a dozen ways

1. Get rid of beverage calories. Stick with a fat-free or 1 percent milk and eliminate soda and sugary drinks like *Sunny Delite* or anything with High Fructose Corn Syrup. (It takes three seconds to check the label.)
2. Replace juice with whole fruit. You'll get more nutrition and fewer calories, ounce for ounce, in the fruit. Plus the fruit has fiber, which you will need if you are eating less.
3. Eat plenty of salads. Try to have one every night with dinner, and go lightly on the salad dressing.
4. Eat lean protein at each meal, especially breakfast. It will help keep hunger away longer so you don't arrive at the next meal starving.
5. Prepare for travel delays. Keep a survival kit handy so you will have low-calorie snacks available and your good efforts won't be derailed.
6. Bring your own food. If you are on the road, then stay at places with a kitchenette and use it for most of your meals.
7. Exercise briskly for at least 30 minutes a day, preferably longer. (Your body does not know it is working out until after 20 minutes.)
8. Remember, exercise is not a chore, but "me" time. Make it fun instead of postponement of fun. Try and exercise when you'd otherwise be sedentary.
9. Keep your expectations real. Aim for losing one pound per week, two pounds max.
10. Try water aerobics. You'll get a great cardio workout.
11. If you're not weight training already, start now. You'll be toned and stronger by the end of the summer.
12. Enlist the help of your spouse, partner or friend. Research shows that couples who lose weight together tend to do well because they benefit from the presence of close, constant support.

### BIO

Osman Yasar (pronounced Yashar) holds 3 master's (physics, nuclear engineering, computer sciences), and a Ph.D. degree (engineering physics) from University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is professor and chair of the computational science (CPS) department at State University of New York (SUNY) College at Brockport. He established the first undergraduate program in computational science in the United States. He is founding director of Computational Math, Science, and Technology (CMST) institute which promotes an integrated approach to math and science education in SUNY colleges and local school districts. Dr. Yasar chairs SUNY Senate 'Graduate Education and Research Policy Committee' which serves the largest university system (more than 410,000 students) in the world. He is a Senate Liaison to Research Foundation of SUNY (with more than \$800 Million annual research awards). Dr. Yasar is an international expert in supercomputing applications in science and engineering. He is well known in his homecountry (Turkey), where he was ranked among Top 30 National Icons in 2005. He is a founding member of world's first stand-alone doctoral program in computational science and engineering (at Istanbul Technical University). He worked closely with industry, including General Motors, Cummins Engine, Chrysler, Intel, and Lockheed Martin. He developed computer ignition models for GM to aid design of new spark plugs. He served as President of Intel Supercomputer Users Group. Prior to his SUNY experience, he was a staff scientist at the

Computational Center for Industrial Innovation (1998) at Oak Ridge National Laboratory. Prior to his ORNL experience, he helped establish a parallel computing laboratory at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1990 and served as a research scientist and lab director until 1994. Dr. Yasar worked closely with the Wisconsin Engine Research Center. He taught Applied Math and Physics at both Inonu University and Hacettepe University in Turkey prior coming to the USA. His area of interest is computational fluid and particle dynamics, engine combustion modeling, parallel computing, plasma and radiation hydrodynamics, and adaptive mesh refinement.

Dr. Yasar served as Publication Manager, Conference Chair, Vice-Chair, and General Chairman of the Intel Supercomputer Users' Group (ISUG) in the past, and currently is the Advisory Chair of ISUG. He served as the Chairman of the High Performance Computing Users (HPCU) Group/Society, a Guest Editor to J. Computers and Mathematics, and an organizer of the High Performance Computing Simulation conference. He is a member of Society of Industrial and Applied Mathematics (SIAM), Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE), Society of Computer Simulation (SCS), and American Physics Society.

The Rochester and District Soccer League (RDSL) is an adult amateur soccer league for the Rochester area. The league is comprised of over ninety men's and women's teams from around the Rochester and surrounding area.
