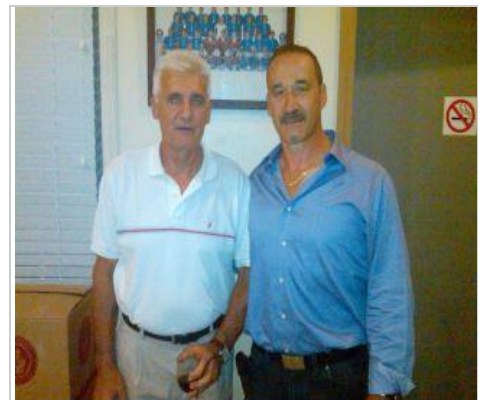
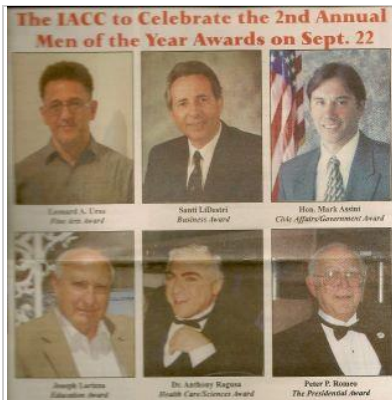

The Skinny on Food Safety Legislation

Food safety legislation slated for consideration in Congress next week is a classic illustration of the push and pull of federal legislation. Some people really like it because of its purpose to improve food safety. Some people really don't like it because it imposes costs on food producers, including small farmers, which could reduce variety and raise costs to consumers.

Where do you come down?

The bill is still being debated, and amendments are still under consideration. But basically it broadens the authority of the Food and Drug Administration in a number of ways. Some examples:

- It requires food importers, exporters, manufacturers, processors, and packers, to register with the FDA and renew their registrations every two years.
- It specifies inspection, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements for food producers' facilities.
- It requires food producers to make records available to the Secretary of Health and Human Services in investigations of adulterated food.
- It requires any food facility that violates food safety laws to pay a fee to cover the costs of its re-inspection or a food recall.
- And it requires food imported or offered for import into the United States to be certified as compliant with established requirements.

The bill would also require the FDA to inspect registered domestic food facilities, and it would require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish several pilot projects to explore and evaluate methods of tracking and tracing food in the United States or imported into the country.

The cost of the bill is about \$16 per U.S. family.

So, are these regulations a good way to make food safer? Would the bill deliver? Or are these a bunch of rules that just interfere with people moving food to the family dinner table? Probably nobody knows the answer, but the Senate will be voting on it this coming week!

FIAT, Chrysler CEO Marchionne among TIME magazine's "Most Influential People"

FIAT SpA and Chrysler Group LLC CEO, Sergio Marchionne, has become the first Italian featured in TIME magazine annual list of the world's most influential people.

Marchionne earned his place by returning Chrysler Corporation to health (*do you recall another "Italian" by the name of Lee Iacocca? years ago he also saved Chrysler*). FIAT took management control of Chrysler under a 2009 U.S. government bailout package. Marchionne had been credited previously for having turned around the Italian auto giant.

TIME magazine stated: "*Without Sergio Marchionne, Chrysler would almost surely not exist today.*"

The 58 year old Italian Canadian became FIAT SpA CEO in 2004 and was widely credited for a "*spectacular rescue*" of a company many experts doubted could survive.

Marchionne was educated in Canada where his family had moved when he was 14 years old. He holds an undergraduate degree from University of Toronto, an MBA from University of Windsor, and a LLB from the University of York. He maintains dual Canadian and Italian citizenship. He is credited with tackling FIAT's problems with an Anglo-American mentality by decreasing bureaucracy and improving marketing and profitability. He has also been credited with a new model of relaxed, hand-on involvement management.

Sergio is most often seen wearing a black sweater is charming and can be bullying. He moved his CEO's office from the executive corporate tower to the fourth floor of an engineering building to be close to his key executives and has since overhauled Chrysler's tired product line. The jury is still out, but early signs indicate promising results. Chrysler turned an operating profit in 2010 and Marchionne's new vehicle models have received some much needed positive reviews.

Described by many around him as a "workaholic," Marchionne often works around the clock, only sleeping for a few hours at a time on his private jet as he flies between the United States and Italy. Marchionne has also been described as temperamental and impatient (*does that sound Italian?*), especially towards what he feels is incompetence of those working under him.

Marchionne was born in 1952 in Chieti (Abruzzo region). The son of Concenzio Marchionne (originally from the Abruzzese town of Cugnoli) and Maria Zuccon from near Labin in Istria. The father was a carabinieri in Istria where he met the mother. His grandfather Giacomo Zuccon was killed in 1943 by Yugoslav partisans near Barban in Istria while his uncle Giuseppe Zuccon was killed by the Nazis the same year.

Sergio began his business career in 1983 in Canada as a fiscal and legal expert with Delotte Touche. He held important positions with Canadian companies then moved to Switzerland with the pharmaceutical company Alusuisse Lonza in 1994. In 2002 he became managing director of Societe Generale de Surveillance, a company well recognized in the field of inspections, testing and certification. In 2006, he was nominated to be a "*Cavaliere del Lavoro*" by Italian President Giorgio Napolitano.
